March 12, 2014

The Marshall County Commission met in regular session on Wednesday, March 12, 2014 at 10:00 a.m. in the Marshall County Commission Chambers.

PRESENT WERE:

Chairman Hutcheson called the meeting to order and asked Steve Swords, Pastor Victory Baptist Church, to deliver the invocation. He then asked Commissioner Kelley to lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

CONSENT AGENDA

A motion was made by Commissioner Kelley, duly seconded by Commissioner Stricklend, all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve the consent agenda as read by Chairman Hutcheson. The consent agenda includes the minutes from the February 26, 2014 commission meeting and the claims docket for February 21, 2014 – March 7, 2014 in the amount of \$980,910.84.

ANNOUNCE TWO (2) WEEK APPLICATION PERIOD FOR TOP OF ALABAMA REGIONAL HOUSING AUTHORITY BOARD APPOINTMENT

Chairman Hutcheson announced the two (2) week application period for Top of Alabama Regional Housing Authority Board appointment. The appointment will be announced at the Commission meeting held on March 26, 2014.

DISTRICT 1 – APPROVE BID INVITATION FOR ONE (1) OR MORE 4-DOOR FULL SIZE PICK-UP TRUCK(S)

A motion was made by Commissioner Stricklend, duly seconded by Commissioner Martin, all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve bid invitation for one (1) or more 4 wheel drive 4-door full size pick-up truck(s).

<u>SHERIFF – APPROVE REQUEST TO PURCHASE PATROL CAR WITH VEHICLE</u> <u>REPLACEMENT FUND; \$20,704.15</u>

A motion was made by Commissioner Stricklend, duly seconded by Commissioner Hale, all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve remaining funds originally approved in the current budget year and transferred to the vehicle replacement fund (\$5,660) for 5 new vehicles, be moved back into the general fund (The 5 vehicles approved were Tahoes, but Chargers were purchased instead, resulting in lower cost). All proceeds from the previous sales of Sheriff's vehicles have gone into the vehicle replacement fund and those funds along with proceeds from future sales can be used to purchase one new vehicle as requested.

APPROVE CONTRACT BETWEEN MARSHALL COUNTY COMMISSION AND PINNACLE SCHOOLS, INC.

A motion was made by Commissioner Stricklend, duly seconded by Commissioner Kelley, all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve Chairman Hutcheson to sign contract between Marshall County Commission and Pinnacle Schools, Inc. This is a standard contract that is approved annually to provide services under a DYS grant previously received.

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<u>REAPPRAISAL – APPROVE BUDGET AMENDMENT TO PURCHASE WIDE FORMAT</u> <u>PRINTER, MAINTENANCE CONTRACT AND SUPPLIES; \$14,641</u>

A motion was made by Commissioner Stricklend, duly seconded by Commissioner Kelley, all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve budget amendment and purchase of wide format printer, maintenance contract and supplies in the amount of \$14,541. These funds will come from rollover funds recorded in line 499.

APPROVE SELL, TRADE OR SCRAP OF FIXED ASSETS

A motion was made by Commissioner Martin, duly seconded by Commissioner Hale, all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve sell, trade or scrap of fixed assets.
