The Marshall County Commission met in regular session on Wednesday, May 11, 2016 at 10:00am in the Marshall County Commission Chambers.

Chairman Hutcheson called the meeting to order and asked Pastor Joey Canady of Solitude Baptist Church to lead the invocation. He then asked County Attorney Clint Maze to lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

A motion was made by Commissioner Kelley, duly seconded by Commissioner Swords, all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve and authorize Chairman to sign lease documents required for purchase of backhoe from CAT Financial.

PROBATE – APPROVE RESOLUTION TO APPOINT JEREMY W. BURRAGE AS THE COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH OFFICER

A motion was made by Commissioner Stricklend, duly seconded by Commissioner Martin, all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve resolution to appoint Jeremy W. Burrage as the Community Mental Health Officer

RESOLUTION

<u>WHEREAS</u>, Act 94-690, Acts of the Legislature of Alabama, 1994, provides among other things, for the designation of a Community Mental Health Officer who would act as a liaison between law enforcement and the general public, which person so designated as Community Mental Health Officer and is employed by a public body such as the Marshall Medical Centers, and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, Jeremy W. Burrage is presently a full time employee of the Marshall Medical Centers and meets the qualifications required to be the Community Mental Health Officer, and,

<u>WHEREAS,</u> the Judge of Probate has made a finding, the County with the approval of the County Commission, be covered by the provisions of Act 94-690, and has designated Gadsden Regional Hospital of Gadsden, Alabama, Brookwood Hospital of Birmingham, Alabama, and Marshall Medical Center North of Arab, Alabama, as the designated mental health facilities for Marshall County, Alabama:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSION AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Commission finds the facilities designated by the State Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, Gadsden Regional Hospital, Brookwood Hospital and Marshall Medical Center North, to be adequate for the detention of persons pursuant to said Act;

2. Jeremy W. Burrage, a full time employee of Marshall Medical Centers is designated as the Community Mental Health Officer with the condition that his compensation be that received from his employer.

3. The Judge of Probate is empowered to do all things required by the Act, to give the required notices, and implement the provisions of the Act with the approval of the County Commissions.
