RESOLUTION
AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING APPLICATION
FOR COUNTY GRANT FUNDS THROUGH
THE STATE OF ALABAMA'S CDBG PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Marshall County Commission has completed its application for County Grant Funds through the State of Alabama's Community Development Block Grant Program, and

WHEREAS, the Marshall County Commission concurs with objectives, needs and program activities proposed therein, and

WHEREAS, priorities for the proposed program activities adopted by the Marshall County Commission were determined in accordance with State and Federal guidelines and determinations on eligibility of activities,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MARSHALL COUNTY COMMISSION:

I. That the Marshall County Commission shall submit an application to the State of Alabama Community Development Block Grant Program for \$350,000.00 in grant funding

- II. to provide reconstruction, paving and drainage improvements to Marshall County roads Drew Drive, Collins Drive, Jason Drive, Lara Drive and Caroline Drive.
- III. That, should the project be approved, the Marshall County Commission shall pledge \$18,800.00 as "in-kind" match funding via the Marshall County Engineering Department.
- IV. That, should the project be approved, the Marshall County Commission shall pledge \$56,031.00 as "cash" match funding.
- V. That said application shall be designated as the officials application for Marshall County to be submitted to the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs upon its completion.
- VI. That the Chairman is duly authorized to sign said application for and act on behalf of the Marshall County Commission and is further authorized to execute all other documents required for application or disbursement of the State of Alabama Community Development Block Grant funds for the Marshall County Commission.

### RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Federal financial assistance as authorized under Section 5310 of the Federal Transit Act Amendments of 1991, is available through the Alabama Department of Transportation to provide transportation services to meet the special needs of seniors and individuals with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, the submission of an application for said financial assistance is deemed necessary to aid in addressing the transportation needs of seniors and individuals with disabilities residents of Marshall County, and

WHEREAS, any agreement for capital financial assistance with the State of Alabama, acting by and through its Alabama Department of Transportation, will impose certain obligations upon the applicant, including the provision by it of the local share of project costs; and

WHEREAS, it is the goal of the applicant to provide the best transit project that can be provided with the funds available.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Marshall County Commission as follows:

That the Chairman is authorized to execute, file a grant application, and enter into an agreement with the Alabama Department of Transportation for aid in the financing of a Section 5310 transportation assistance project.
