A motion was made by Commissioner Shumate, duly seconded by Commissioner Watson and all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve the consent agenda presented as read by Vice Chairman Joey Baker. A motion was made by Commissioner Sims, duly seconded by Commissioner Watson, and all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve the Resolution Confirming and Ratifying the levy of Countywide 40-12-4 sales tax in favor of Boaz City Board of Education.

RESOLUTION AND ORDER

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER CONFIRMING AND RATIFYING THE LEVY OF THE COUNTYWIDE 40-12-4 SALES

TAX IN MARSHALL COUNTY

BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED by the Marshall County Commission (the "Commission"), the governing body of Marshall County (the "County"), as follows:

Section 1. Findings. The Commission hereby finds and declares that there is levied in the County, pursuant to Section 40-12-4 of the Code of Alabama 1975, as amended, and an ordinance of the Commission adopted pursuant thereto on December 14, 2022, a special privilege or license tax and an excise tax at the basic rate of one percent (1%) (herein together called the "General Act Sales Tax"), the proceeds of which are allocated and apportioned among the various boards of education in the County, a portion of the proceeds of which are allocated and paid to the Boaz City Board of Education (the "Board"); and that the Board has notified the Commission that the Board proposes (a) to issue its Special Tax School Warrants, Series 2024, in the approximate aggregate principal amount of \$45,000,000 (the "Warrants"), for the purpose of financing various public school capital improvements to the Board's educational facilities, to consist of the construction of a new public school, and (b) to pledge, for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Warrants, those portions of the proceeds of the General Act Sales Tax presently being allocated, apportioned and paid to the Board.

Section 2. <u>Pledge</u>. The County hereby pledges, to the Board and to the registered owners of the Warrants, the Board's allocated or apportioned share of the General Act Sales Tax and agrees that it shall continue to levy, at rates not less than those at which the said taxes are presently levied, and provide for the collection of, the said taxes and shall continue to pay the Board's allocated share of the proceeds thereof over to the Board until the final retirement of the Warrants, now expected to occur on or before July 1, 2050.
