EMA – APPROVE TO PURCHASE 25 SIREN AMPS TO REPAIR SIRENS THROUGHOUT THE COUNTY; \$15,656.25 PLUS SHIPPING TO BE PAID OUT OF COUNTY-WIDE FUNDS.

A motion was made by Commissioner Shumate, duly seconded by Commissioner Sims, and all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve the purchase of 25 siren amps to repair sirens throughout the county in the amount of \$15,656.25 plus shipping to be paid out of the County-Wide Funds.

APPROVE RESOLUTION EXPRESSING OFFICIAL INTENT TO ISSUE GENERAL OBLIGATION WARRANTS TO PAY OR REIMBURSE THE COST OF CAPITAL EXPENDITURES.

A motion was made by Commissioner Baker, duly seconded by Commissioner Sims, and all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve the Resolution expressing official intent to issue General Obligation Warrants to pay or reimburse the cost of Capital Expenditures.

A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING OFFICIAL INTENT TO ISSUE GENERAL OBLIGATION WARRANTS TO PAY OR REIMBURSE THE COST OF CAPITAL EXPENDITURES

WHEREAS, MARSHALL COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Alabama (the "County"), has determined that it is appropriate and in the public interest for the County to finance the cost of acquisition and construction of certain capital expenditures to the facilities of the County, which may include, without limitation, a jail facility and related public safety facilities and equipment (collectively, the "Project");

WHEREAS, the County expects to finance all or a portion of the costs of the Project through the issuance of tax-exempt, general obligation warrants (the "Warrants"), and, accordingly, it is necessary and desirable for the County to declare its official intent to issue the Warrants and to authorize certain matters preliminary to the offering to the public market, and the issuance, of the Warrants; and

WHEREAS, the County has not finally determined the cost of the Project but the County does not expect the principal amount of the Warrants to exceed \$30,000,000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF MARSHALL COUNTY, as follows:

- 1. Pursuant to 26 C.F.R. 1.150-2(e) of the Federal Regulations, the County does hereby express its official intent (a) to issue the Warrants in a principal amount not to exceed \$30,000,000 to, among purposes, pay or reimburse the County's general fund for costs paid for the Project within 60 days prior to the date of adoption of this resolution or costs paid after the date of adoption of this resolution; and (b) to issue such additional amount of Warrants, or to incur such additional indebtedness, to pay any premiums or fees for credit enhancement for the Warrants, and to pay the costs of issuance related to the Warrants.
- 2. Subject to Section 3 hereof, the County does hereby approve, adopt, authorize, direct, ratify and confirm:
- (a) the appointment and engagement of Raymond James & Associates, Inc. as underwriter (the "Underwriter") in connection with the issuance and sale of the Warrants;
- (b) the appointment and engagement of Maynard Nexsen PC. as bond counsel in connection with the issuance and sale of the Warrants and the preparation thereby of the financing documents for the Warrants; and
- (c) the preparation and distribution by the Underwriter of a preliminary official statement with respect to the Warrants on behalf of the County.
- 3. Notwithstanding Section 2 hereof, the issuance and sale of the Warrants by the County shall be subject to and conditioned upon: (a) the final approval and authorization thereof by the County Commission of the County, which further approval shall specify the details of the Project to be financed, use of proceeds, principal amounts, terms of maturity and payment dates, interest rates, offering prices and redemption prices and terms, and costs of issuance and credit enhancement, if any; and (b) the approving legal opinion of Maynard Nexsen PC, as bond counsel.
- 4. All actions heretofore taken, and all agreements, documents, instruments and notices heretofore executed, delivered or made, by any of the officers of the County with respect to any matters referenced herein are hereby ratified and confirmed.

WHEREAS, in the forty-two years since Act Number 82-206 was passed into law, advancements in technology and the prevailing human resources practices of hiring and recruitment have changed significantly; and

WHEREAS, in order for Marshall County, Alabama to be positioned to compete with the private sector for recruiting qualified individuals to fill vacancies within the Marshall County, Alabama workforce, certain amendments to Act Number 82-206 are needed; and

WHEREAS, the Marshall County Commission hereby request that the Marshall County Legislative Delegation sponsor a proposed amendment to Act 82-206; and

WHEREAS, the amendment to Act Number 82-206 as proposed by the Marshall County Commission is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

NOW THEREFORE be it resolved that the Marshall County Commission respectfully request that the Marshall County Legislative Delegation consider sponsoring the attached, or similar, proposed amendment to Act 82-206.
